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SECTION I - Introduction

A survey was carried out in 23 maternity centres attached to the hospitals and health centres in the Sultanate of Oman during the period* 1st July 1978 to 31st December 1978 (6 months). The objective of the survey was to provide information on family unit, child births, child deaths and particulars about latest birth. Copies of the questionnaire ** designed by the Directorate General of National Statistics in consultation with the Ministry of Health were sent, along with instructions for completing it, to all the hospitals and health centres where women were admitted for delivery. The subjects were the women patients admitted for delivery of a child in the maternity centres during the period 1st July 1978 to 31st December 1978. They were asked the questions following admission in the centre (generally before child birth) with details of births being recorded subsequently.

- 2. Similar surveys were carried out in 1972 and 1974. The findings of those surveys are contained in the two reports brought out earlier by the National Statistical Department (now Directorate General of National Statistics).
- 3. The following table shows the number of questionnaires received from various maternity centres through the Ministry of Health. The data was analysed at the computor centre attached to the Directorate General of Financial Affairs under the technical guidance of the Directorate General of National Statistics. In all 11,554 questionnaires were received and analysed.

4. The standard of completion of the questionnaires and the response to the enquiry was quite satisfactory. The forms were filled in by the hospital staff* after enquiring the details from the women. These were scrutinized and coded at the Directorate General of National Statistics. The sheets containing the coded data were sent to the computor Centre along with a statement and dummy tables for analysis. The following section summarizes the results of the survey.

SECTION II - Results of the Survey

Ages of the women:

5. The women were asked about their ages in completed years at the time of admission to the maternity centres. The age distribution of women as classified in five year age groups is shown in Table 2 below. About 89% of the women were in the age group 20-39 years and the overall average age worked out at 27.8 years for all women. Many women did not know their exact ages and estimation had to be made by the interviewer about their ages after carefully enquiry from the women.

Region of usual residence:


6. The women were asked about the place of their usual residence. The following table shows the percentage distribution of women admitted for delivery by geographical region of the delivery centre and the region of their place of usual residence. About 25.2% of the total number of women admitted had their place of usual residence as Capital Area; 23.8% came from Batinah, 12.5% from Oman Interior, 8.5% from Jaalan & Sur, 7.5% from Sharqiya, 5.7% from Dhofar, 5.5% from Western Hajar, 5% from Dhahirah & Buraimi, 3.5% from Eastern Hajar and 2.8% from Musandam Area.

First visit to the maternity centre:

7. The women were asked as to when did they first visit the maternity centre for seeking advice after becoming pregnant. The following table shows the distribution of women by age-groups and periods of gestation at the time of their first visit to the maternity centre. Only 7% of the total number of women visited the centre within 3 months of their pregnancy, 26.2% within 6 months, 34.7% within 9 months and 32.1% came at the time of delivery. Generally the younger women visited the maternity centre at earlier stages of pregnancy for advice than the older women.

Future visits to the maternity centres:

8. The women admitted for delivery were asked whether they would be visiting the maternity centres after the delivery of the child with a view to seeking the post-natal advice, and, if not, the reasons thereof. It is heartening to note that 96.7% of the women indicated that they intended to have post-natal advice by visiting the maternity centres. Only 3.3% indicated that they did not intend having post-natal advice, the main reason being their living too far away from the maternity centre. The distribution of women, by age-groups, intending to seek or not intending to seek post-natal advice and reasons for not seeking advice is shown in table 5 below.

Number of children born:

9. The number of children born alive to 11537 women admitted for a delivery during the period of six months was 11501 and the number of children born dead was 195. Among live births 52.1% were male children. The following table shows the distribution of children born alive by sex and type of birth (i.e. single, twins or triplets)

Weight of the child at birth:

10. The weight of the child born alive at the maternity centre was recorded in kilograms and grams. The overall average weight of the child born alive was about 2929 grams. The average weight of a male child was 2974 grams and that of a female child 2880 grams. In other words, the average weight of the male child was 94 grams more than that of the female child. The average weight of a child was 2947 grams when born single, 2242 grams when born twins and 1433 grams when born triplets. As already stated a similar survey was carried out during 1974. In that survey, average weight of a child born at the maternity centre was 2820 grams against 2929 grams indicated by the present survey. This shows that weight of the live born child has shown improvement in view of better nutritional diet due to improved standard of living and pre-natal advice available at maternity centres. The following table shows the distribution of live born children by sex, weight at birth and type of birth.

Normal and abnormal delivery:

11. About 96.5% of the total deliveries taken place at maternity centres were categorized as 'normal'. Among'abnormal' deliveries 53.8% were 'caesarean' and 42.3% 'Breech p'. Table below gives the distribution of women by age groups and by normal or abnormal delivery.


Interval since last previous live birth:

12. Information on birth-interval was obtained by asking the women about the date of their last previous live birth. It was, however, observed that this information related, in most cases, to year of last previous live birth rather than to date or month. The interval between the present live birth and the last previous one could thus be estimated roughly. For 17.3% of total number of women, it was their first delivery. For 87.2% of the total number of women who had previously delivered, the interval between the present and last previous live birth was 3 years or less and for 65.8% it was 2 year or less. Overall average interval came to two and half years only. The following table shows the distribution of women by age groups and time elapsed since last previous live birth.

Children born alive and children now living:

13. Information was obtained about the number of children born alive (including the present live birth) during the entire life time so far from the present or previous marriage(s) if any and the number of children living at the time of interview whether with her in the household or away from her. Total number of children born alive (including the most recent live birth) during the entire married life so far by 11554 women was 44270 out of which 22634 or 51.1% were males and 21636 or 48.9% females. Out of 44270 children born alive, 37091 children were living at the time of the interview. Out of 37091 living children 18709 or 50.4% were males and 18382 or 49.6% females. Among the 33091 children living only 384 were living away from the household at the time of interview. As against 44270 born alive to 11554 women during their entire life so far, the number of children born dead was 1082. Overall average number of live births for woman worked out at 3.83. The average number of live births per woman increased from 1.32 for the women of the age-group less than 19 years old to 7.45 per woman for the women more than 40 years old. The overall average number of children living at the time of interview was 3.21 per woman. In other words out of 100 children born alive only 84 had survived. The survival rate goes down further to 78 if the present live births were excluded. Table 10 below shows the distribution of women by age groups, number of children born alive and number of children living at the time of survey.



Survival rate for male and female children:

14. As already stated out of 100 children born alive (including the most recent ones) only 84 had survived. The following table shows that the survival rate for females is 85 and is thus more than the that of males which is 83 only per 100 children.

Literacy status of women and live birth:

15. Information was obtained regarding the literacy status of the women admitted for delivery. A 'literate' was she who was able to read with understanding and to write a short statement of everyday life in any language. About 9.4% of the total number of women admitted for delivery were categorized as 'literates'. The percentage of literate women to the total women was higher in younger age-groups than the older age-groups thus showing the effect the vigorous educational programmes taken up during the last 8 years or so. Distribution of women by age groups, literacy status, number of children born alive and among those now living or dead is shown in table 12 below.

16. The overall average number of children born alive worked out at 2.85 for 'literate' women and 3.93 for 'illiterate' women. One of the reasons for the lower average number of live births for literate women is that the literate women are comparatively more in the younger age-groups. Another reason could be that they wish to restrict their number of children with a view to providing better facilities to them. Out of 100 children (including the most recent ones) born to 'literate' women, 92 had survived while for 'illiterate' women the survival rate was 83 only. The following table shows the distribution of 'literate' and 'illiterate' women by the average number of children per woman born alive and living at the time of interview.

Women with more than one marriage:

17. Information was collected from the women admitted for delivery as to whether this was their first marriage or that they had married before and as to how did the marriage end. Out of 11554 women admitted for delivery 842 (or 7.3%) had married more than once. The distribution of these 842 women by age groups and the reasons for dissolving the previous marriage(s) is shown in table 14 below. It may be seen that for 74.8% of these women the reason for dissolving the previous marriage was 'divorce' and for 24.7% it was due to death of their husbands. The percentage of women whose marriage ended with divorce is comparatively high among women of younger age groups than the older age groups.

18. Distribution of woman who married more than once by their place of usual residence and the reasons for dissolving the previous marriage is shown in table 15 below. It may be seen that 'divorce' rather than 'death of the husband' has been/main reason of ending the marriage in almost all regions but more so in Dhofar, Jaalan & Sur and Dhahira and Buraimi regions.

Re-marriages and live births:

19. Distribution of women by age groups, number of marriages and number of live births is given in table 16 below. The average number of live births worked out at 3.78 with 'one marriage', 4.59 with 'two marriages' and 5.54 with 'three marriages or more'. The main reason for higher averages for the women with more than one marriage could be due to the fact that comparatively they belongs to the older age-groups.


Distribution of women by age groups and specified number of living children

20. The distribution of women by age groups and specified number of living children (including the most recent one) is given in table 17 below. About 60.7 percent of the total women admitted for delivery had 3 living children (including the most recent one) at the time of interview. The average number of children was 1.2 only for the women upto 19 years of age and 5.2 for the women more than 40 years of age. Among the children living at the time of interview 50.4 percent were males and 49.6 percent females.

It shows the distribution of women who had atleast one live birth (prior to the most recent delivery they had in the delivery centre) by age groups and specified number of children who were born alive but now dead. In Oman, infant and child mortality is high and thus nearly 41 percent of women, who had atleast one live birth, had experienced a loss of atleast one child. It is interesting to note that even among women under 25 years of age, nearly one-fourth of the mothers had experienced loss of atleast one child.

Economic activity and occupations of the husbands of the women admitted for delivery:

24. Women admitted for delivery were asked about the type of economic activity and the present occupation of their husbands. Much reliance could not be placed on the data thus collected since many women were not accurately aware of their husbands' occupations or the economic activities in which they were engaged. However the information as collected has been analysed and is given in the following tables. Table 21 shows the distributions of husbands of the women admitted for delivery by their economic activity and geographical regions of their usual residences. Out of 11554 women admitted for delivery as many as 3895 (or 33.4%) did not state any information about their husbands economic activity. The remaining gave the economic activity of their husbands as follows:

25. The classification of husbands of the women by occupational groups and regions of their usual residences is given in table 22 below. This information is not available for 2497 men (i.e. 21.6%) of the total).
